That might have been the trigger for the "Durmerscher Bäredriewerfäschd", celebrated for the first time in 1978.

Under the then mayor Heinrich Bauer, a concept was quickly found in which the Durmersheim clubs and groups would play a leading role.

The participants developed a great sense of community by pouring most of their fixed proceeds into a common pot. The purpose was to build a barbecue and rest hut on the edge of the Hardtwald.

The "Bäredriewerhütte" has been a popular place for resting since 1979 and has also become an ideal place for celebrating beautiful forest festivals.

A sense of community paired with honorary commitment and an awareness of a tradition worth preserving are still in demand today and again, so that our "Durmerscher Bäredriewerfäschd" has a future in the years to come.
